

Obituary - Graham Johnson

I first met Graham when I came to Peterborough Diocese and we played for the diocesan cricket team together. We shared a love of sport generally though he was lucky enough to have some ability too! I like to think I encouraged him to join the CCCC and he was soon displaying his chess skills, sharing the title in 1975 and 1976 before winning it outright in 1977. By now he was much loved Rector of three rural parishes and then in 1983 he came to be Rector of Daventry in the deanery of which I was rural dean. He was a joy to have in the deanery and his positive attitude to life and ministry benefited all of us. He took over as rural dean after me and his natural care for everyone was much in evidence. Although very practical he was also deeply spiritual and became Warden of Launde Abbey, the Leicester Diocesan Retreat House and for two further years rural dean there too. In all his ministry he was wonderfully supported by Diane his wife, who, herself was later ordained. In his latter years he battled with Parkinson's Disease until he had to retire. At his funeral the Bishop of Leicester described him as "one of his most faithful and creative priests" Our sympathy goes out to Diane and his family.

Treasurer's Report on the 2012/13 Accounts

A very good year financially! Subs were dramatically up by £80.80 compared with last year. £72 of that increase was a life subscription, and our Canadian associate member paid two years' subs in one go. The increase in NS&I interest rates brought in an extra £3.44, and a donation of £10 completed the rosy picture on the income side.

It was an equally happy story as regards expenditure – there was very little of it. Our esteemed Secretary, having bought a large stock of stamps last year to beat the Royal Mail price rise, did not need to claim any expenses at all this time, and I was able to confine my own outgoings to the cost of one 2nd class stamp. The high proportion of members accepting electronic delivery has continued to keep communication costs low. Our BFCC affiliation fee was unchanged.

At the end of the financial year the value of the Life Membership fund stood at £42.07 per Life Member (previous year: £36.97). No withdrawals were required; indeed I was able to pay back £20 into the LM fund from surplus cash. Total assets, though not quite at record levels, represent a very comfortable reserve in terms of typical annual expenditure.

All subs were paid up at the end of the financial year, though at the current time (December 2013) there are arrears of £,5.75.
