


CURRENT SEASON

GAMES

As always, my thanks to Michael Thistlewood who edits and prepares the games for the magazine. He does an excellent job but can only work with the material you send in, so please send in game scores, annotated if possible. In the absence of any games from members for this issue he has instead written an article, illustrated by games, on John Owen, our very own answer to Ruy Lopez!

SCHEMING MIND TEAM

We again finished 4th in our Division in the last season of this tournament. Despite losing two of our top players we decided to enter again this year. Although the season began with a narrow defeat by knightworm78 (4-6), we then even more narrowly beat The Chess Masters $5^{1/2} - 4^{1/2}$, before losing (again 4-6) to México. We are currently leading SCCA C Team 3-1, and were given a walkover against The Chess Warriors as they were unable to field a team.

Can we strengthen our Team?

That Chess Warriors are struggling to raise a team shows that we are not alone in that regard. Our Team is weaker than it was, and smaller, meaning that team members are having to play in more rounds than they used to. It was suggested to me by someone on Scheming Mind that we might open our team to non-members. To do this I think we would have to rename the team as it would no longer strictly be CCCC.

We are **not** talking about membership of the Club here, which would remain open only to clergy, but merely to our SM team, which would allow affiliates to join. Would we want to charge them a membership fee, or would we simply be happy to have them strengthen our Team?

I would be interested in members' views on this, as well as possible titles for a more open team. A couple of ideas that occurred to me were *Clerics and Friends* or The *Cleriwhos*, but like with our magazine title, someone might have a much better idea.

Treasurer's Report on the 2020/21 Accounts

This year's surplus of £248.40 is the largest in my 25 years as CCCC Treasurer. We have gained another Life Membership, sold nearly all the remaining copies of the *Alice* book, and received two donations. I will comment briefly on each of these elements in turn.

Life Memberships obviously boost our accounts, as they are fully credited in the year they are paid, rather than being apportioned over a longer time (I have to keep things simple!). At the end of the financial year we had 3 annual members, and at the time of writing, February 2022, we have just one. You will be pleased if not surprised to know that there is no sub outstanding.

Our publishing venture in November 2017, *The Chess Player's Alice*, has been a financial success. At the year end the surplus was £50.03, and of the print run of 130, there were 9 left. Congratulations to Bruce on his fine judgment, and thank you to all who purchased a copy, or multiple copies.

Both the donations were in connection with the *Alice* book, generous overpayments – one of them very generous!

On the expenditure side, the EFCC affiliation fee has increased by 40%, but this is the first rise since 2010.

At the end of the financial year 2020/21 the value of the Life Membership Fund stood at \pounds 53.01 per Life Member (previous year: \pounds 46.42).



Owen's Defence


I often used to play the Ruy Lopez as White and I later learned about Owen's Defence as Black. This seemed to me to be very fitting as Ruy Lopez was a Catholic Priest and John Owen was an Anglican Priest.

Owen's Defence is b6 which can be played straight away against almost any opening. It is good to be played against those who have done masses of preparation against more regular replies! It is now known as the English Defence.







He adopted a pseudonym 'Alter'. I believe this was because he didn't want his parishioners to know he played chess, because many Christians thought that chess was sinful!






