


#### **BISHOP'S MOVE?**

As I was preparing this issue I read an article about a rare book, a copy of which had come up for sale. The *Summa Collationum*, an instruction manual for priests, was written by John of Wales, a 13th century Franciscan theologian, but claims to use the rules of chess as examples of good and bad behaviour. He says that the King is able to move in any direction because 'the king's will is law,' while rooks represented justices and so moved straight and rigid, symbolising that they always acted justly. He is however less flattering of Bishops whom, he said, 'move obliquely ... because nearly every bishop misuses his office for cupidity [avarice].' Pawns represented poor men and move diagonally when taking from others, teaching that they only advance in life when they move straight. But the most striking difference from the present game is that of the Queen, which can only move one square at a time and that diagonally because 'women are so greedy that they will take nothing except by rapine [violent seizure] and injustice.' Some of this perhaps needs to be read with care as writers of moralities were known to vary the 'rules' of such as chess to suit their ends, but you have to ask what move he might have allowed a female bishop, were he even to imagine such a thing existing! There is of course a fair bit of research into some early forms of the game in our own founder's work, *The Chess Player's Alice*, only a few copies of which now remain.

#### Treasurer's Report on the 2021/22 Accounts

Though not matching last year's record-breaking £248, this year's surplus is a very healthy £160.79. This is due to two new Life Memberships, though even without them we would have managed to cover our costs – just!

Unless we recruit new members, these surpluses seem unlikely to continue, as we now have only one non-Life Member, and we are down to our last few *Alice* books.

However, I want to assure everyone that the Club's finances are very healthy. Our capital reserves are ample in terms of servicing our annual running costs for many years. You will be pleased to know that there is no sub oustanding.

At the end of the financial year 2021/22 the value of the Life Membership Fund stood at £55.36 per Life Member (previous year: £53.01).

NS&I restructured their product range last year, reducing the Investment Account interest to almost nothing, though at the time of writing (December 2022) rates have recently returned to something nearer the previous year's.

Thank you to those who support us financially by buying Scheming Mind tokens.


The figures on the expenditure side call for no comment.

His other claim to fame was organising a large chess competition for juniors all over the country. I believe thousands took part. Here are some of his games.


